Plant choice: fruits borne on plants that are small, pest resistant, tasty, pretty

Special landscape features of fruit plants

Fall color: Lowbush blueberry (*Vaccinium angustifolium*)

Decorative fruits: Seaberry (*Hippophae rhamnoides*)

Neat winter form: Cornelian cherry (*Cornus mas*)

Winter bark: Juneberry (*Amelanchier* spp.)

Ornamental flowers: Medlar (*Mespilus germanica*)

Fragrant flowers: Clove currant (*Ribes odoratum*)

Espalier: Red currant (*Ribes* spp.)

Potted plant: Fig (*Ficus carica*)
